WHO WE ARE

Arts In Reach (AIR) offers free arts programming for girls and gender-expansive youth ages 11-18. AIR programs are experiential, teen-driven, and collaborative. They focus on building a supportive and inclusive community for teens to make friends, explore their creativity with the guidance of professional teaching artists, and take safe risks through the arts.

INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY

AIR creates a safe and inclusive community that welcomes and values differences in ability, culture, ethnicity, gender expression, personal experience, race, religion, sexual orientation, and socioeconomic status.



OUR PROGRAMS

AIR programs are designed for two age groups, ArtVentures for ages 11-13 and AIR Artists for ages 14-18. There are also additional workshops and field trips designed for all of our teens. Programs change each year to allow us to provide a variety of artistic mediums that are relevant and engaging to Seacoast teens.

WHY AIR?

NH teen mental health is a crisis, especially for teen girls and gender-expansive youth, and mental health resources for youth are scarce. Wealthy inequality continues to challenge the Seacoast, and suicide and substance abuse numbers are steadily climbing for teens.

AIR strives to ensure that teens have opportunities to grow personally and professionally through barrier-free access to high-quality arts programming and inclusive mentoring. Connecting with each other and their community, they are able to gain skills, relationships, and the hope they need to thrive.
